Bible Study-Ambassadors for Christ

Bible Study is a must if we are to grow and develop spiritually, In doing this study our goal is to learn and grow together as a congregation. As such this study is meant to be done by all; individually or in groups and then to share as a congregation.



We start with the reminder that we are Ambassadors for Christ. *2 Corinthians 5:20.* The focus then is on the Christ, not us. Mark 16:15 commands: *"Go into all*

the world and preach the Gospel ..." Matthew 28:19 gives a similar mandate. So we are charged with taking the Word to others.

CONTEXT: Read 2 Corinthians 5

The Message starts at the end and works back to the beginning. In this Chapter Paul reminds the Corinthians that death is inevitable for all

human beings. As such we are to work towards that goal. This is done through spreading the message of Salvation.

Thus we must become Ambassadors for Christ. When we do this, others have the opportunity to experience that abundant life leading to eternal life.

Read 2 Corinthians 5:20-21

- \Rightarrow What does ambassador mean?
- ⇒ What does Paul mean by ambassadors for Christ?
- ⇒ Look carefully at the phrase that follows:"...as though God was making an appeal through us -Explain?
- ⇒ Continue with the other phrase: "...we beg you on behalf of Christ be reconciled to God." How are we reconciled to Christ? What part does repentance play in this? Discuss.
- \Rightarrow Examine and explain the phrase "He made him who knew no sin

- to be sin on our behalf..."
- \Rightarrow What is meant by the righteousness of God.?
- ⇒ Go back and read the entire Chapter. Take time to note how the verses are divided, look for the various messages individually and explain them.

1. Verses 1–5 What do the references to naked and unclothe mean?

2. Verses 6-10 what are some of the key words and phrases that help us to understand what Paul is saying? How are we encouraged?

3. Verses 11-15 The motto of the Methodist Church "The Love of Christ constrains us" is contained here. What should this mean for us? 4. Verses 16-19 What does Paul mean when he says "we recognize no one according to the flesh"?

- \Rightarrow How do we become ambassadors for Christ?
- \Rightarrow What then is the role of Christians as ambassadors?
- \Rightarrow Share other messages you received coming out of this text.

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
